Mike's Questions for Civic Engagement in EE

These are the questions I've come up with for the 20 minute Environmental Education Projects Forum(EEPF)/TEEP segment of the annual meeting (12/3). They are also the initial basis for the EEPF/TEEP V workshop, which I assume will now be in mid-January, 2021.

The questions are somewhat aligned with the Biden Climate Change Plan and with some local initiatives that have been discussed at past TEEP workshops. They are meant to be initial points of discussion.

For the annual meeting we would briefly review present EEPF/TEEP projects for 5 minutes and then show these questions with any additions, deletions or edits, and ask for feedback with respect to their inclusion as points of focus at the January workshop.

- What curricula on climate change is available and/or can be created to reinforce student activities around school weather stations?
- What curricula on climate change is available and or can be created to reinforce student activities around school solar energy installations?
- What curricula on climate change is available and/or can be created to support student comprehension of electric cars and their expansion in the U.S?
- What activities and materials can be used to help instill values in students that lead to their participation in citizen action for climate change?
- What activities and materials can be used to help students understand the importance of "green infrastructure" in reaching net zero carbon emissions?
- How can we help students explore that developing a greener economy will reduce air and water pollution and improve public health?
- What activities and materials will help students understand the need to reduce methane emissions to slow global warming?
- What activities and materials will help students understand the most effective ways to improve energy efficiency in buildings, transportation,etc.?
- How can we help youth understand the relationships between addressing climate change and protecting biodiversity?
- What activities and materials can be employed to help students understand the connection between specific resilience measures and climate change?
- What activities and materials will help students understand how an improved, modern system of railroads can reduce carbon emissions?

- How can we help youth explore societal and community systems with the goal of developing plans to achieve net zero carbon emissions?
- How can we help youth understand the relationship between food production systems and climate change?
- What activities and materials can help students understand how environmental justice relates to all initiatives to address climate change?

Things to communicate to Membership, from Strategic Priorities, Month 1-6: Organizational Leadership/Communications

- Communicate new direction to membership (mission):
 - o frame EEAC as a learning organization
 - be honest/transparent about EEAC shortcomings and gaps, and ask for help/suggestions. Acknowledge that achieving our mission will require a great deal of listening/learning on the EEAC's part
 - Prioritize sharing the goals/needs of the new EEAC and ways to engage membership and not-yet-members in being a part of the next phase of EEAC to help distribute the workload
 - o Reinforce the new mission statement

Encourage Active Participation

- Keep members informed of fun and valuable volunteer opportunities
 - \circ $\;$ Recruit new members to increase potential contributors to the work
 - Actively remind membership of committees/roles they can volunteer for--what are the benefits to volunteering, and how much fun it is (ongoing)
